As of 8:00 am, McPherson County **does not** have any positive cases of COVID-19.

McPherson County Health Department (MCHD) will provide public notification of any positive COVID-19 cases in coordination with State and Local Health Officials. Specimen collection is occurring daily in McPherson County at multiple provider locations.

As of March 24, 2020, the current recommendation of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), the State of Kansas, and MCHD is to limit social gatherings to under **10-persons**.

- Should events under the **10-person** threshold take place, social distancing should be practiced.
 - Social distancing includes placing a 6-foot distance between persons attending as much as possible. If said 6-foot distance cannot be exercised, it should last no longer than 10 minutes.
 - Restaurants and bars should preserve social distancing of 6 feet between tables, booths, bar stools, and ordering counters and cease self-service of unpackaged food, such as salad bars or buffets. We also encourage services to occur through delivery, carry-out or drive-thru when possible.

As of March 24, 2020, the KDHE is **mandating** 14-day home quarantine for Kansans who have:

- Traveled to California, Florida, New York, or Washington state on or after March 15.
- **Traveled to Illinois or New Jersey on or after March 23.**
- Visited Eagle, Summit, Pitkin and Gunnison counties in Colorado in the week of March 8 or after.
- Traveled on a cruise ship or river cruise on or after March 15.
- Traveled internationally on or after March 15.
- Received notification from public health that you are a close contact of a confirmed COVID-19 case.

Personal judgement should be exercised in limiting all non-essential social gatherings and non-essential travel.

McPherson County residents should notify McPherson County Health Department of their return from the above stated locations for guidance or questions about home quarantine. Guidance documents are available at mcpersoncountyks.us.

Testing for COVID-19 is evaluated by healthcare providers. At this time, testing can only be performed on symptomatic people. People who are currently being tested for COVID-19 should remain in home isolation until results are available. If the test results are negative, isolation is no longer required. If test results are positive, the person must remain in isolation until released by public health.

It is the recommendation of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment and McPherson County Health Department that the public does not purchase household items or food products in large quantities.
